**Subject:** Expanded Eligibility for COVID-19 Booster Shots and Pediatric Preventive Use

Summary: The FDA has expanded eligibility for COVID-19 booster shots and has authorized the Pfizer BioNTech vaccine for prevention in children ages 5 through 11.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has expanded the use of a COVID-19 booster shot for eligible populations and authorized the emergency use of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine for the prevention of COVID-19, for children ages 5 through 11 years of age. This follows authorization of the vaccine by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for this age group.
