**Subject**: 72-Hour Emergency Supply for Pharmacy Prior Authorization Drugs

Summary: Pharmacies should dispense a 72-hour emergency supply of medications denied due to prior authorization while awaiting determination.

AmeriHealth Caritas New Hampshire wants to avoid delays in getting our members' medicines. If a prescribed drug is denied due to prior authorization (PA), your member can get a 72-hour emergency supply of the drug while we reconsider covering it or making a medical necessity (MN) determination.

Federal law requires us to provide a 72-hour emergency supply to avoid interrupting or delaying treatment. All participating pharmacies are authorized to provide a 72-hour supply of medication while awaiting a PA or MN determination.

## There are exceptions to this policy

There are times when we cannot provide a 72-hour emergency supply:

- 1. When the medication is not classified as "Safe and Effective".
- 2. When the medication belongs to a noncovered therapeutic category (e.g. cosmetic agents, infertility treatments) as outlined by New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services.
- 3. When using the medication could worsen the member's condition or cause a bad drug interaction.
- 4. When using the medication for a short time and then stopping could be harmful.

The 72-hour supply does not guarantee the member's medication will be approved after a PA or MN determination. The pharmacy will be paid for dispensing this 72-hour supply even if the medication is ultimately denied.
